SCIENCE FAIR:

The 2012 CHVE science fair was a complete success! We had over 260 participants with 206 projects. Over 50 community judges spent the morning engaged in conversation with students about their projects. This is a significant event in the lives of our students and our community volunteers champion our students' learning. Many of the judges return year after year and have commented on how impressed they are with the bright minds and poise of our students at CHVE. We are so grateful for their volunteerism and support.

Mr. Regalbuti is our science fair coordinator. This is a significant undertaking and we deeply appreciate his extra hours to organize the various science fair events and communications. He certainly couldn't do any of this without the tireless dedication of our parent volunteers. Janney Carpenter, Nicole Seawell, and Shannon Ponder put in countless hours and mobilized parent and community volunteers with grace. In addition, I want to thank Mr. Regalbuti, Mrs. Chavez, Ms. Derre, Mrs. Kirby and Ms. Breen for supporting our fifth grade students. They exhibit contagious enthusiasm for science to our fifth grade students on a daily basis, and especially in recent weeks. Special thanks to Mr. Reynolds for letting us use the gym, Mrs. McQuaid for all of her assistance with certificates and awards, and all other CHVE teachers and staff for their roles in supporting students throughout the science fair. I also want to thank our community volunteer coordinators Sherry Sargent and Eileen Griffin who recruit and organize the community judges. This is a huge job and we appreciate their time and effort. Last but not least, I want to thank parents. Science fair projects are a major undertaking and much of the coaching and planning support falls on you. It is a great experience for our students, one with lasting memories and valuable learning.

- I have cleared my calendar for voting day so that I am available to observe and maintain the security of our building.
- Dolphin Club will be in the cafeteria during normal operating hours. We will ask Dolphin Club parents to pick up and drop off at the exterior cafeteria doors.
- In an effort to provide parking to voters, staff members will park and shuttle from Cherry Hills Country Club to school. Don't be fooled by the empty parking lot. We will be here on Election Day.

Did You Know....

That Arapahoe County is changing their practice of voting at neighborhood polling places to voting at Vote Centers. That means that there will be significantly fewer locations to vote this election year. This could result in longer lines. To avoid the lines you can request a mail in ballot. Please do not assume you will receive a mail in ballot. If you did not vote in the last election you may not receive a mail in ballot. You can check your status at this link:

Arapahoe County will be using Vote Centers on Election Day.

They will be open 7 a.m. to 7 p.m.

The Vote Centers will be in place of individual polling places.

If you are registered to vote in Arapahoe County, you may vote at any Vote Center.

Election Day! - November 6, 2012

Mail Ballot Applications must be filed no later than 4:30 p.m. on the Tuesday immediately preceding the election in order for voters to receive a ballot in the mail. Voters who wish to vote a Mail Ballot in the County Clerk's office may file an application until 4:30 p.m. Friday, November 2, 2012.

The election office will begin mailing Mail Ballots approximately 22–18 days prior to Election Day. Voted Mail Ballots must be received at the Clerk & Recorder's office **no later** than 7:00 p.m. on Election Day, in order to be counted. Mail Ballots received after 7:00 p.m. on Election Day will not be counted.


